

Repository of Postgraduate and Undergraduate thesis in Forensic Science – making University student research available to the community

Criteria for submission of a thesis

Research thesis can be uploaded to a repository hosted by Jorum. The **criteria** for selection of a thesis are as follows.

First some small print and caveats:

- it is requested that consent is obtained from the student/author prior to submission to Jorum,
- that the thesis must have been ethically approved and appropriately risk assessed (through normal university protocols), and
- that the University has submitted the thesis through Turnitin or other appropriate plagiarism detection software.

Criteria - As a guide it is recommended that:

1. Thesis graded as a 1st or 2.1 (undergraduate) or Distinction or Merit (postgraduate excluding PhDs)
2. The title (original title or a new title in no more than 30 words)
3. The full thesis should be uploaded as a PDF (Ideally excluding ethical consideration forms and risk assessments)
4. If there are key documents and appendices (e.g. CD-ROMs etc.) these can be indicated as a list on the main submission template and not necessarily be submitted to Jorum
5. Key words for metatags (ideally up to 10 words)
6. Author/student name (first name and surname format - no further contact details required and student has the right to request their thesis be anonymous, in which case names must be removed from the thesis documentation uploaded to Jorum)
7. Supervisor's name (Jorum refers to as 'Contributor')
8. Supervisor's contact details (email address provided in the Jorum 'Description' field when submitting a thesis)
9. University name (Jorum refers to as 'Publisher') and main campus address and switch board contact number (included in the Jorum 'Description' field)
10. Level of project UG/PG (included in the Jorum 'Description' field and add these individually as key words i.e. 'undergraduate', 'postgraduate' and 'thesis')
11. Creative Commons Attribution-No Derivatives licence recommended for all thesis uploaded is recommended.
